### Religious Education Program

#### Grades One – Seven

The “We Believe” program by the Sadlier Publishing Company has been a proven Catechetical Program. The Sadlier Company has been established since 1832. Recently the Catholic Press Association of the United States and Canada awarded the “We Believe” (K-6 Series) the 1<sup>st</sup> place Educational Book Award. This program Inspires, Informs, and Involves Today’s Child, Catechist, Family and Community. It engages children in a variety of prayers and invites them to share their life experiences. The content presented is also age appropriate, culturally inclusive, and easy-to-grasp. In grade seven, the students are introduced to the New Testament. This study offers young people a mature appreciation of their faith. A study of Jesus Christ and His disciples is the focus of this year’s program.

### Confirmation I and II

These years are a preparation for the two-year requirement of the Diocese of Palm Beach. Beginning candidates must be an eighth grader, a registered member of the parish, must have received the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist, and be presently practicing his/her faith. Year I students study the fundamentals of the Catholic faith, using the text, One Faith, One Lord. Year II students become involved in community service as they seek out ways to respond to the Holy spirit in new and deeper ways. The text used for this second year of preparation is The Spirit Sets Us Free. Fall registration will begin in April.
